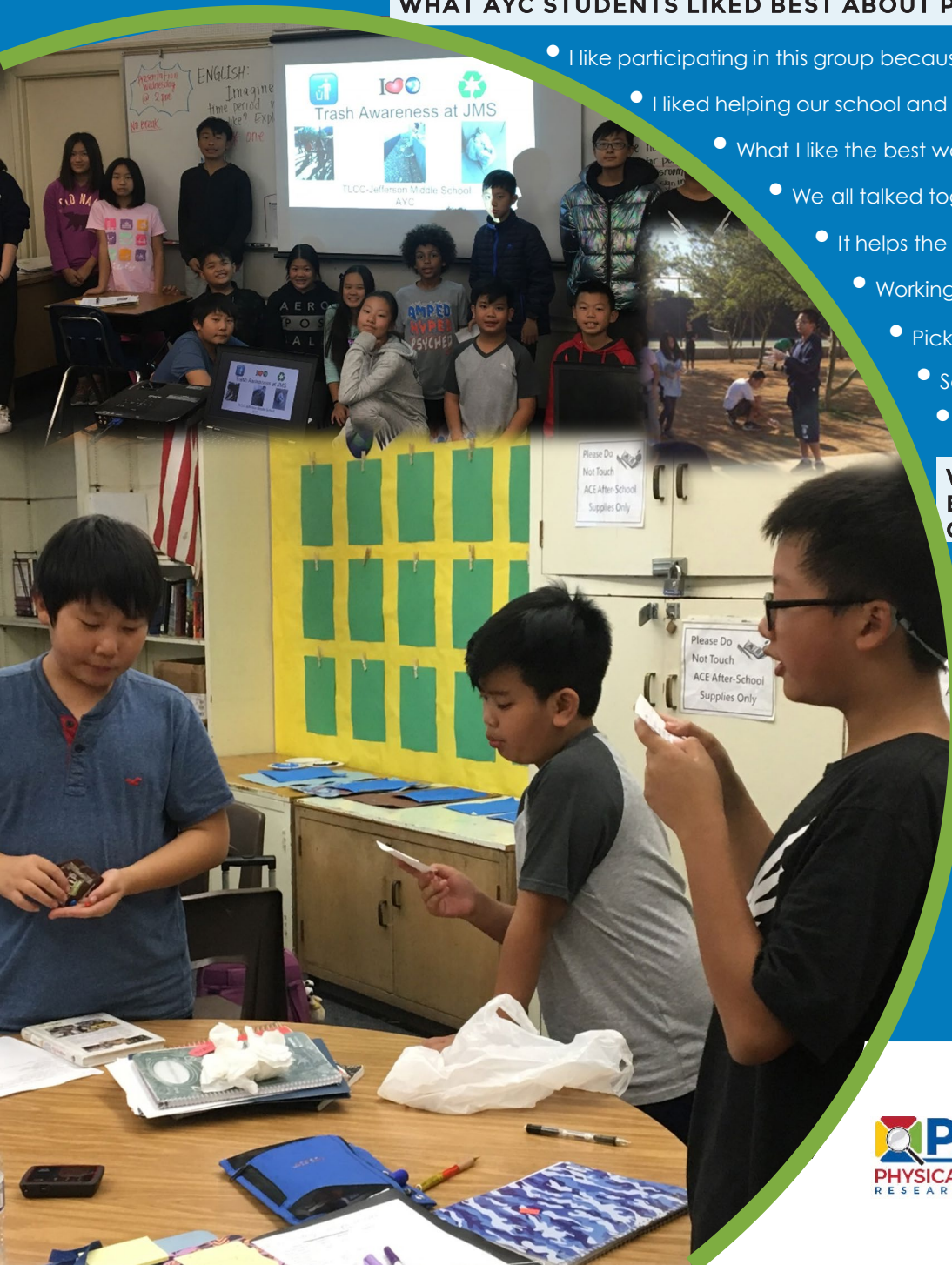
Club Summary
