- 3. Fill in the street names for "Street #1," "Street #2," "Street #3," and "Street #4."
- 4. Repeat these steps for each school your teams will identify.

ISTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE SCHOOL ASSESSMENTS

- 1. <u>During</u> the assessment, please take pictures of items that interest you. Identify and take photos of the problems found for each topic area classified on the assessment form.
- 2. The sections labeled "Schoolyard" and "School Features" may require you to enter the campus to complete questions 9-17.

If the school is open, ask permission at the school office before you go on campus.

Make a note on the assessment form if campus staff ask you to leave. If the school is closed, you may go on campus if it is not locked; write a note on the assessment form stating that the school is closed.

- 3. If advertisements are present for the vending products, please take pictures as instructed.
- 4. Your team will be taking a close look at street traffic and walkability at the 4 intersections and along the 4 streets surrounding each school.
- 5. Meet with your team after examining each of the 4 intersections and streets to complete the assessment forms.
- 6. Take pictures to answer questions 34, 36, 38, 39, 40, 41, and 42 on each street.
